We want to persuade the district council to designate the fields to the south and west of the village as a valued landscape, allowing Bodicote to hold onto its rural feel and so remain as a village.

The new housing built to date has largely avoided this scenic land. But with the district council considering once again moving parts of Bodicote into Banbury, what green spaces we have become even more precious, for us and for the natural environment.

If we act now, we can work to save our fields for future generations. If we don't, there may come a time when we lose them forever. Help us protect your countryside and your village by supporting our campaign.

Community Governance Review

The district council is currently running a consultation looking at the boundary between Bodicote and Banbury. The last time this was done, the village ended up losing half its land, with the houses built at what is now Longford Park being transferred into Banbury after many new residents had moved in.

In order to protect our cherished countryside into the future, we need to ensure that the housing developments being built in the village stay within Bodicote and so form part of our ongoing contribution to Cherwell's housing provision. Keeping our boundaries as they are also allows us to remain viable as a separate village with all the benefits that brings. The alternative is to be converted into just one suburb of many, with diminished representation as part of Banbury town.

Bodicote Circular Walk

Bodicote has a popular three mile circular walk that winds its way through the village and surrounding countryside. The Parish Council has recently taken on stewardship of this walk and will be updating the leaflet and signposts in 2022. If you are interested in being a footpath warden for this or for other Bodicote rights of way, let us know.

Village Defibrillator

There is a defibrillator for emergency use located at the Village Hall next to King's Field on White Post Road. The council will also be installing a second defibrillator outside the Spar store early next year.

What does the Parish Council do?

Parish Councils are the most local tier of government in England, and you may not know that a small portion of your council tax comes to us to care for the village.



Some of the things we do include:

We set the precept and ensure best value for the village – this is shown on your council tax bill

We maintain all parish owned land and the Churchyard

We manage and maintain the burial ground on Wykham Lane

We arrange for the verges to be cut in the growing season and for litter collection throughout the village

We provide public litter and dog bins, as well as some of our benches and bus shelters

We comment, support or object to planning applications We represent the village to the district and county councils
